A pun is a joke that uses words that sound alike or have more than one meaning. You take a word and swap it out with a similar word to be silly or funny.

Some words are spelled and sound the same, but they have different meanings.

In this book, Spoon tells Mac and Cheese to “use their noodles.” Macaroni is a noodle, but “noodle” can also be a slang word for head or brain.



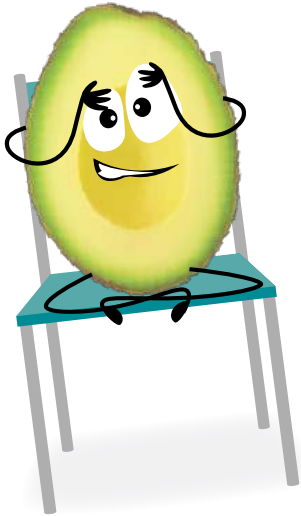
Some words sound the same, but they are spelled differently and mean different things.



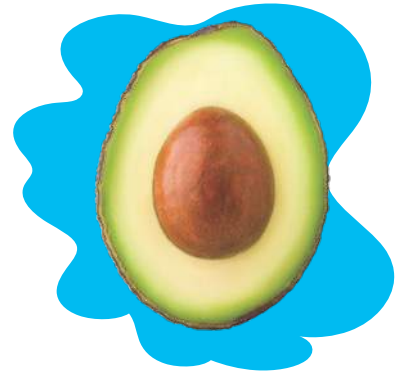
Mac says Cheese is “grate-ly” appreciated. “Great” and “grate” sound the same, but great means a big amount, and grate means to grind, which is how you get shredded cheese.



Sometimes, you can find a word inside another word.

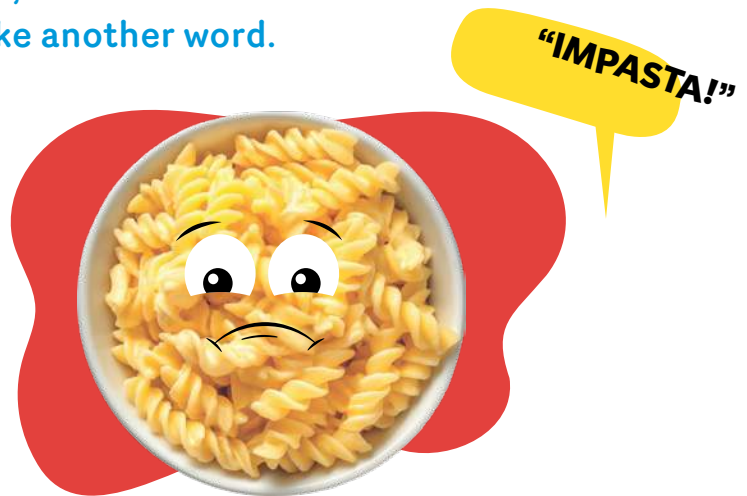


Avocado calls toast
